Friends,

As you have heard, I feel called to participate in the Poor People's Campaign. In speaking with many of you, both the understanding of the movement and my reasons for representing our congregation specifically aren't fully understood. While I do have some additional reasons for personally joining with Rev. Drs. Barber and Theoharris in this new/old movement, I will attempt to give you some context with why it makes sense in my role as your pastor.



First, for many of you it is the first time you are hearing of the Poor People's Campaign. Some of you, as I did, may think of this movement as something new. Actually, the movement was founded in 1968 by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

"Dr. King saw that poverty was not just another issue and that poor people were not a special interest group. Throughout his many speeches in the last year of his life, he described the unjust economic conditions facing millions people worldwide. He held up the potential of the poor to come together to transform the whole of society. He knew that for the load of poverty to be lifted, the thinking and behavior of a critical mass of the American people would have to be changed."

Thank you for the snack donations for the showing of the movie Poverty, Inc, shown at First Christian Church, Coralville and co-hosted by New Disciples.

What I would really like to address is the current context of how I feel called to work alongside and within this movement. I want to say emphatically that the campaign is nonpartisan. As you all know, I moved to Iowa from North Carolina and poverty has been a thread throughout my own life and my ministry. Part of what drew me to this congregation was its care for the refugee community and its mission statement.

The statistics on poverty right here in our home state are startling. 35% of Iowans are poor or low-income—a total of 1.1 million residents. 23.9% of census tracts in Iowa are at-risk for being unable to afford water. As a clergy person, I feel that Jesus calls me to publicly advocate for the poor and disenfranchised members of our community. Engaging with Feed Iowa First, SafePlace, and Poor People's Campaign allows me to do just that.

The national campaign as part of M.O.R.E. tour will be in Des Moines in January. Specific dates have not been finalized yet. But, if you would like more information, feel free to join the campaign for updates or make an appointment to talk with me one on one.


Our Journey Together
